Remembrance Crosses

for our 'Field of Remembrance' are now available either at the main door of the Church or from the church office during the week. Giving Tree

This year's Giving Tree charity is **Smalls for All**.

Smalls for All is a Scottish charity which works in partnership with a number of organisations to collect and distribute underwear to help women and children in Africa. They help those living in orphanages, slums, Internal Displacement Camps and schools as well as providing underwear to hospitals to help those suffering from some medical conditions. At the moment they are working with partners to make up 'hygiene packs' for girls and young women and have asked for donations of black "full" pants for these packs. They also need underwear for boys aged 3 to 15 years. Underwear is something we really don't give much thought to but it is vitally important to girls and young women who may have to miss school if they don't have any, and as we know, education is one of the best ways to help lift people out of poverty. As in previous years, we will be very grateful if you will take one or more gift tags from the tree, purchase the item on the tag and put your gift into the marked basket at the main door. The last day for receiving donations is **Sunday 2nd December**.
